fireworks, the different masses of gasses, nitrogen bubbles, and the reaction of basic and acidic solutions and how baking soda and vinegar explodes!

I had so much fun hearing these children's goals. This experience was heartwarming, especially when a couple of children told me that they now aspire to be chemists because of the knowledge I have shared and the experiments they have done. These children were very grateful to have us. They even sang a song and it was the sweetest! It is always hard to live in an orphanage with no idea when you will get parents and some of these children came from abusive households. I am very fortunate to have the opportunity through the OC chapter of the American Chemical Society to spark joy, knowledge, and curiosity for these children.

I also did an outreach to my previous school in Makati, Philippines where I spent ten years studying elementary school to high school. Here, I had a talk on matter, my research, careers in
