OCACS to Celebrate our Orange County College Award Winners

The Orange County Local Section has a long history of honoring our local college and high school students.

In 1970, we began to honor the top college students from ourlocal community colleges and universities each year, which makes 2017 our 48thAnnual College Awards Dinner.



Our firstyear, we honored students

from 9 schools, and since 1986 have held steady atabout 12 - 15 students. These studentsare selected by the faculty from their respective schools. At first, they were included in the highschool awards dinner, but now, we have a separate honors dinner for the collegestudents, where they and their faculty sponsor are given dinner and acertificate, along with a \$50 gift card and their name on the school'sperpetual plaque. In 2016, we honored 14 studentsfrom 14 colleges and universities.

At each awards dinner, we invite a featured speaker from the local scientific community to present information about his or her research. This year <u>Dr. Gregory A. Weiss</u> from the Department of Molecular Biology and Biochemistry at UCI will present "<u>Listening and Dancing with Life's Molecular Machines</u>". The American Chemical Society designates selected buildings where seminal chemistry discoveries took place as National Landmarks. Rowland Hall on the UCI campus has been granted such a designation in honor of the Rowland/Molina ground-breaking work on CFCs and stratospheric ozone loss.

The Landmark Dedication will be held at Rowland Hall at 4:00 pm on Tuesday, April 18, with a reception following the dedication. The AirUCI Institute is holding a two-day symposium on April 18 and 19th structured around the Landmark Dedication. The symposium will honor the history of this field at UCI, and move to the present and future as represented by the new faculty hired UCI to maintain its research excellence in the area of atmospheric sciences.

Dr. Harshad Kulkarni, Research Scientist at Pacific Advanced Civil Engineering (PACE), Inc., will be our next speaker for the 2017 OCACS Environmental Group meeting on Thursday, April 27th, 2017.

Dr. Kulkarni recently joined PACE after he finished his PhD in Civil Engineering at Kansas State University, Manhattan, KS. He will be presenting his PhD research, which illustrates the interesting biogeochemistry of natural organic matter and arsenic in groundwater, in particular



the importance of organic matter in arsenic mobilization by iron reducing bacteria in the arsenic rich aquifers.

Arsenic contamination of drinking water wells has still been a wide-spread problem in the United States and around the world. Please see <u>this flyer</u> for more information.
