Environmental Solutions

The April Environmental Program Presentation is on April 28 at 7:30PM. It is entitled "Renewable Energy Production and Energy Efficiency Improvements in Wastewater Treatment Facilities" by Mark McDannel, P.E., BCEE, the Supervising Engineer at the Los Angeles County Sanitation Districts.

Specifically, treatment of municipal wastewater requires large sums of energy for pumping, aeration, and water removal from residual solids. They also provide the opportunity to make renewable power from digester gas generated during solids treatment. This presentation will provide an overview of energy usage, efficiency, and generation at wastewater treatment plants operated by the Los Angeles County Sanitation Districts. Key topics to be covered are:

How and where is energy used in wastewater treatment, how much is used, and how much it costs.

An overview of the Districts Energy Efficiency Management Program, which since its start in 2006 has resulted in savings of over \$7.5 million through reduced energy usage, utility rebates, and finding mistakes in utility bills.

The Districts digester gas-to-energy program, which has been in place

since 1938. A review of available power generation technologies will include technical issues, air emissions, and costs.

Biography

Mark McDannel is a Supervising Engineer in the Energy Recovery Engineering Section at the Los Angeles County Sanitation Districts. The Districts operate nine renewable power plants, six landfills, and 12 wastewater treatment plants. The Energy Recovery Engineering Section is responsible for a variety of activities at the Districts including development of renewable energy projects, purchase and sale of electricity, energy efficiency, and regulatory affairs. Mr. McDannel has over 30 years experience in air quality, combustion, and energy. He holds an M.S. from the University of California Irvine Combustion Laboratory.

OCACS Education Matters

Our Orange County Section April Dinner Meeting is combined with the College Awards Dinner Meeting on Thursday, April 28 at Concordia University. This year, the speaker is Bruce Houlihan from the Orange County Crime Lab and his presentation is entitled "The Influence and Impact of Forensic Science as a Career". The event starts at 6PM with dinner, the Presentation and the Awards Program to follow.

As to the presentation, the Orange County Crime Lab (OCCL) is responsible for handling over 50,000 items of evidence a year related to the crimes and investigations in Orange County. Established in 1948, the OCCL is a nationally recognized leader in crime lab services, including: DNA, fingerprinting, toxicology, driving under the influence of alcohol and drugs, explosives, firearms, controlled substances, crime scene investigation (CSI), and other vital services. Mr. Houlihan will be discussing a history of OCCL in the forensic field; specific cases involving homi-

cide, armed robbery, and serial killers that used DNA and forensic techniques; what it is like to testify in court as an expert witness on life and death cases; and how to prepare and apply for a career in forensic sciences.

Biography: Mr. Bruce Houlihan is Director of the Orange County Crime Lab in Santa Ana, California, and has been with the County of Orange for 24 years. He spent much of his childhood living in Tokyo, Japan, and also Southern California where he was born. After completing an undergraduate degree in chemistry and physics, he spent a year doing graduate study in chemistry at the University of California, Irvine, and another two years of graduate leadership study at Vanguard University in Costa Mesa. He continued teaching science at Vanguard University for many years as a part-time adjunct while working for the Sheriff-Coroner as a criminalist. After being hired in the mid 1980's, he began work in the forensic chemistry areas, specifically analyzing drugs in both biological samples and solid dose forms. Mr. Houlihan serves at one of

the largest crime labs in the country, with over 130 forensic specialists, forensic scientists, and support staff. He lives with his family in Orange County, and in his spare time enjoys reading, creative thinking, and puzzles.
