- All their teachers


Parents/Guardians of the Award winners are invited to attend, and in some years there are as many as 300 attendees.

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Recent Outreach by Younger Chemists

Virtual Chemistry Magic Night

A "magic" evening was conducted with graduate students and a professor leading middle-school and younger children in hands-on chemistry experiments. Kids' Science kits were purchased from a commercial supplier and distributed to a wide swath of children in at-risk communities in Santa Ana, CA.



In a webinar-style meeting over Zoom, approximately 75 families, including over 150 children, carried out the experiments in their own homes, following the directions given live by the grad students. The event was conducted simultaneously in English and Spanish, since the "home language" for many of these children is Spanish. The effort was supported by a Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Respect (DEIR) Grant.

Chemistry at the Farmers Market

Led by the Orange County YCC, a group of graduate, undergraduate and high school students designed, organized and performed a live demonstration of chemistry experiments to a wide range of adults and children at the Orange Home Grown Farmers & Artisans Market. No entrance fee was charged, and being open to all members of the community, the event attracted people of all backgrounds and ages.

Communications



An estimated total of 200 people attended the two events. The program comprised 4 new demonstrations like Storm Clouds and Elephant Toothpaste, and one hands-on activity (slime) for K-8 children. The audience reported that it was the highlight of their visit to the Market that day.
